

How to Participate:

Story Structure – Engaging beginning, middle & end

Submissions Open: February 1, 2025

Deadline: May 31, 2025 (Submit to your class teacher 3 days earlier or submit at the Woodville Library)

Winners Announced: August

Award Ceremony: September 5, 2025, at Woodville Town Hall

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Number Ninjas

IHM is excited to introduce **Number Ninjas**, a targeted school-based intervention program designed to strengthen maths fact fluency for Year 2 students. This small-group program runs twice weekly, focusing on developing number fluency—the ability to quickly and accurately work with numbers - a crucial foundation for future mathematical success.

Through engaging, hands-on activities, structured practice, and a games-based approach, Number Ninjas helps students build confidence, improve number sense, and master essential skills such as counting, subitising, and basic addition and subtraction. This program ensures all students develop a strong numeracy foundation, setting them up for future success.

Families can support their children's early numeracy development by incorporating simple activities at home. Encourage counting everyday objects, playing number games, using dice and dominoes, and practicing recognising numbers in daily routines. Making maths fun and interactive helps build confidence and fluency, preparing children for lifelong mathematical learning.
